

# Woodlawn Avenue Corridor Landmark District

The Woodlawn Avenue Corridor consists of both sides of Woodlawn Avenue and the east side of University Avenue from 58<sup>th</sup> Street (the Robie House) to 55<sup>th</sup> Street, and 56<sup>th</sup> Street from Woodlawn east to Kimbark Avenue. This large group of remarkable buildings serves as the graceful transition between the University of Chicago's historic campus to the west and Hyde Park's historic residential section to the east. As the campus expands and the neighborhood evolves there is danger that some of these historic buildings could be demolished or substantially disfigured, potentially a great loss to the University and the Hyde Park community. The surest way to protect the integrity of the Woodlawn Avenue Corridor is to establish a Chicago Landmark District, similar to the district established in the Kenwood part of our neighborhood in 1979. The Woodlawn Avenue Corridor is the largest group of architecturally significant buildings in Chicago not already protected by landmarking.
